

Collection of waste equipment

Information on waste from electrical and electronic equipment

When you buy electrical or electronic equipment from us, we will, in accordance with the law, provide you with free collection of the waste equipment which comes from your household, at the place of delivery of this equipment, provided that the waste equipment we are to take back is of the same type and has performed the same functions as the equipment you buy from us.

If you buy from our showroom (cafe) - we will collect such equipment from you in the same showroom, at the time of purchase or upon presentation of proof of purchase of new equipment of the same type from this showroom.

If you buy online - at coffeedesk.pl or coffeedesk.com - please inform us when you place your order that you would like us to collect such used equipment, or email us at hello@coffeedesk.pl - we will arrange transport and provide you with the necessary instructions.

In accordance with the law, we would also like to inform you that disposal of waste equipment together with other waste is prohibited. The owner of such household equipment is obliged to hand such equipment over to a waste collector or other authorised entity. The following crossed-out wheeled bin pictogram is a symbol of separate collection and means that waste from electrical and electronic equipment must not be disposed of together with unsorted municipal waste.



You can also return such equipment to PSZOK (Point of Selective Collection of Municipal Waste) throughout Poland, including, for example, in Kołobrzeg at VI Dywizji Piechoty str. 60 or in Warsaw at Płytowa str. 1, Zawodzie str. 1, Tatarska str. 2/4 or Kampinoska str. 1.

In accordance with Article 37 of the Act of 11 September 2015 on Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (Journal of Laws 2015, item 1688, as amended):

- 1. The distributor is obliged to collect waste equipment from households at the point of sale, free of charge, provided that the waste equipment is of the same type and has performed the same functions as the equipment sold.*
- 2. The distributor, when supplying equipment intended for households to a purchaser, is obliged to collect the used household equipment free of charge at the place of delivery of that equipment, provided that the used equipment is of the same type and has performed the same functions as the supplied equipment.*
- 3. The distributor operating a retail unit with a sales area within the meaning of Article 2(19) of the Act of 27 March 2003 on Planning and Spatial Development of at least 400 m² dedicated to the sale of equipment intended for households shall be obliged to accept at that unit or in its immediate vicinity, free of charge, used household equipment, none of whose external dimensions exceeds 25 cm, without having to purchase new equipment intended for households.*
